The City of Madison and the Madison Metropolitan School District

Located in the south central portion of the state, Madison, Wisconsin, has an estimated population of 243,344 and is the home of the University of Wisconsin and the state capitol. Although Madison has a few diversified industries, the city is primarily a residential community. Madison has long been considered a leading medical, cultural and educational center of the Midwest.

East High School is a microcosm of the city of Madison, reflecting its rich ethnic cultural and economic diversity. The University of Wisconsin provides numerous enrichment opportunities and brings many national and international experts into our school community to live and work.

The public school system includes thirty-two elementary, twelve middle and four comprehensive high schools and one alternative high school. In addition, the district offers early childhood programs and secondary level alternative programs.

East High School is a comprehensive four-year high school. East was awarded a "School of Excellence" award in 1989 by the U.S. Department of Education and is accredited by the Wisconsin State Department of Public Instruction and the North Central Association.

Graduation Requirements

A minimum of 22 units or credits in grades nine through twelve are required for graduation. These units must include:

- English4 years (4 credits)
- Social Studies.....3 years (3 credits)
- Civics Test Requirement.....Must pass
- Math.....3 years (3 credits)
- Science3 years (3 credits)
- Health1 semester (.5 credit)
- Physical Education..... (1.5 credits)
- Electives (9 credits)

Grades and Class Rank

Cumulative grade point average is computed beginning with the ninth grade. Student may elect to exclude physical education from their GPA. Transcripts do not automatically include class rank. Grade point average is based on a 4.0 scale with A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, and F=0. Grades are not weighted. Additional grade designations include WD=Withdrawal from class, I=Incomplete, and MD=Medical Excuse. Coursework taken through Madison Virtual Campus is designated with a "V-" on the transcript.
